**POCATELLO** – The Idaho State-Civic Symphony (ISCS), the oldest orchestra in the state of Idaho, has announced its 2019-2020 "Storied Season." Through carefully selected music, each concert will tell stories that connect audiences through shared and individual human experiences. The season features pieces that embody the American spirit, the wonderment of the holidays, the strength of overcoming adversity, and the joy and pain of falling in love. This season's **Classical Series** will feature five programs that encapsulate artistic director **Julie Sorensen**'s vision of shared experiences through the power of musical storytelling.

Americana Stories (September 20, 2019) highlights works by composers inspired by the American experience, including Charles Ives' *Symphony No. 1*, Grant Still's *Afro-American Symphony* and a newly commissioned piece by composer Zhou Tian, commemorating the 150th Anniversary of the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad.

**Joy to the World: The Stories of Christmas** (December 6 and 7, 2019) reunites the Camerata Singers, the ISU Choirs and the Idaho State-Civic Symphony when they perform holiday classics and sing-alongs that warm up cold winter nights.

In **Tales from Opera and Literature** (February 7, 2020), the ISCS welcomes Grammy Award-winner and Pocatello-native, **Jessica Jones**, who will be performing selections from some of opera and literature's most captivating stories like Lehar's *The Merry Widow* and a familiar favorite, Bizet's *Carmen*.

The tragedies and triumphs of war have inspired composers to create some of their greatest **Tales of Sorrow and Triumph** (March 13, 2020). Whether written as responses to personal experiences, or as tributes to heroes or victims, Prokofiev's *Jewish Dances*, Shostakovich's *Symphony No.* 9, and other compelling musical stories, will show us the power of the human experience.

Idaho State University's newest music faculty member, **J. Curtis Thompson**, will join the Orchestra to perform Castelnuovo-Tedesco's *Guitar Concerto No. 1* in a program that presents **Stories of the Sublime** (April 24, 2020) and elevates the senses. Also featured is Beethoven's *Pastoral Symphony* that pays homage to the awe and wonder of the countryside.

This season's **Pops Concert** will celebrate the **Stories of the Silver Screen** (October 25, 2019) by showcasing scores from *American in Paris, James Bond* and *The Good the Bad and the Ugly.* 

The **Halloween Family Concert: Fairytales and Superheroes** (October 26, 2019) will spark imaginations and inspire future music-lovers with orchestral versions of soundtracks from some of their favorite movies. They will feel like they're part of the action when clips from *The Incredibles, Superman, Batman,* and *Shrek,* are accompanied by live orchestra.

The **Idaho State-Civic Symphony Youth Orchestra** (ISCSYO) provides Southeast Idaho's most dedicated music students with opportunities to perform challenging repertoire in a professional format. Youth Orchestra performances this season will be on **November 14, 2019** and **April 10, 2020**. These performances are free and open to all ages.
